

How old were you when you first started riding horses and what sort of riding did you do?

I started riding when I was 6 years old at a farm in Hollidaysburg PA, near my hometown. I started out riding hunter/jumpers and when we moved to Virginia I participated in 4H and took lessons/summer camps in Chesterfield at Whitetail Farm (and rode and enjoyed some Western as well!) Wintergate Farm swimming out of the pond and dumped her right in in Mosely and Level Green Riding School in Powha-

My family did not have a lot of money, so I would get lessons when I could. Sadly, it looked like I would never be able to afford to own my own horse. However, being a determined horse crazy girl, I saved every penny, mowed lawns, pet sat, baby sat, sold artwork and did odd jobs until I could afford to adopt a "free" horse that I had come across. It was one of the greatest days of my life!

Do you have a favorite breed of horse?

I love all breeds of horses- they are just so magnificent! I will say I have a soft spot for Anglo-Arabs (my first horse J) and Thoroughbreds. I also loved with the horse. So eventually, I found myself doing Quarter Horses that were my first teachers when I less and less jumping and more Dressage! was young. In more recent years, I've had the pleasure of riding and training the powerful and intelligent Warmbloods!

Why do you think you love horses?

I am not exactly sure why I love horses, I cannot remember ever NOT loving them- I was born this way! I think it is their power, beauty and the bond you achieve with them in your training journey. Also, after a stressful day at work, there is nothing better than seeing them, smelling them and hearing them greet you when you get to the barn! Also, my niece who is 11, summed it up pretty well when she said this while we were riding together one afternoon: "Aunt Heidi? Do you love riding so much because your horses let you feel like the most important person sitting way up here?"

What is your happiest/maybe funniest memory with a horse?

Some of my best memories was riding my first horse with my best friend. I boarded my horse at her farm and we would ride our horses everywhere on trails near her home. One trail in particular, would bloom, completely covered in daffodils. We loved to trail ride there in the spring and the beauty was amazing! We decided it was probably what Heaven was like J We would also swim the horses in her pond and race each other on a flat dirt road until the wind would pull the tears down our faces!

One summer, her horse spooked while we were the mud! I was trying to get off my horse to make sure she was ok but my horse was spooking at her rolling in the mud trying to get up so I had a hard time getting to her. She was fine, and we laughed so hard as the one half of her body that landed in the mud was completely coated in mud and she looked hilarious!

Why did you want to do dressage?

After many years enjoying the Hunter/Jumpers, I was introduced to Dressage when I started eventing. It really spoke to me regarding the harmony, elegance, lightness, communication and bond that you build


