The purpose of the George Williams Young Professional Grant Fund is to support dressage professionals, ages 25-35, who are committed to the sport and have established businesses as instructors and trainers. Applicants should have a strong desire to participate in continuing education opportunities, in order to provide higher-quality instruction to their students.

The amount of the grants can vary depending on the need and request of the applicants but will typically range from \$3,000 - \$5,000. At this time, one grant will be available each year to a qualified applicant chosen by an independent selection committee.

SUMMER FUN IN THE SUN The 7th Annual VADA Chapter Challenge Schooling Show

The VADA Chapter Challenge Schooling Show will return to Northern Virginia on Saturday August 3rd, hosted by VADA/Nova. This year's venue is newly refurbished Morven Park, with all new state of the art footing in all rings, recently repainted barns and other improvements. If you haven't been there in a few years, you won't believe it is the same facility.

Returning this year is the ever-popular MFS Stakes Class (for VADA members only.) Prize money will be awarded to the first three placings. We will also be holding a Junior Team Challenge as part of the show. If you are a member of a local Virginia dressage chapter, you are automatically a member of VADA. Non-VADA members can enter the show, but are not eligible to participate in the Chapter Challenge or Junior Team components, or the MFS Stakes. We expect this to be a 2-ring show, so there will be plenty of room for all!

Remember, this show does not require you to enter as a team, so there is no need to round up folks to enter with you. It is just a great way to build team spirit and comradery among members of your Chapter. All you need to do is decide what tests you want to ride, fill out the entry form and indicate what VADA chapter you are riding for. All USEF/DF dressage tests are offered and included in the Chapter Challenge. Other tests such as the MFS Stake and western dressage will be available as well but scores will not count towards the Chapter Challenge. Each class will be individually pinned through 6th place. Then, individual scores will be used to determine which VADA chapter reigns supreme. Bragging rights go to the winner, along with special awards to the top six placing chapters. If your chapter does not have enough riders entered to compete in the Chapter Challenge part of the show, you can still enter and be part of a VADA mixed chapter team. In addition, each chapter is sponsoring a "special award" including high score rider over 50 years old, the rider who has traveled the furthest distance to compete, and many others.

Technician, Horseman or Both

I am not a horse expert. I have only been riding them for the past 59 and a half years. But I have learned a few things with the blessings of having ridden some great critters and had some wonderful trainers and instructors over that time. The first thing I learned was, don't blame the horse. They are horses. Most mistakes from riding are human miscommunication/lack of understanding errors. That is always with me no matter how pissed off I am at my mount on any given day for actions they may or may not have done. My fault. Period. Fix me.

I have also learned that there is a huge difference between technicians and horsemen. Technicians can give you the tools to create and cause a horse to respond a specific way. Horseman can take those skills and tell you why they work based on the way a horse thinks. I have been lucky to have had both of these in my horse life and each have been the additional melding of how I ride. But a true horseman who is a technician is the best you can be on a horse. I am still striving for that for myself.

I have chomped at the proverbial bit to get on my youngsters and just fly away because they are so smart and beautiful and talented. But I have always taken a step backward and put in the ground work that most riders do not do because it can be tedious. I am not talking about lunging a horse until it is ready and warmed up enough to accept you as a partner. I am talking about getting into that round pen and really doing the basic work of creating a true partnership with your horse. There is something magical about connecting with a magnificent creature that is so powerful and majestic. To see that moment when the horse accepts you as it's leader and makes you a part of it is the real battle, its ears, chewing, licking and accepting your leadership, the rest is gravy.

So many times I see someone in the arena with a horse that they bully or force. They get out of that spotlight then proceed to punish afterward that creature who is merely trying to understand. One would not take a toddler and demand that it start jogging or reciting the Lords prayer on command now would one? But we expect it from a young horse who may not be mature enough or an old horse who has not been worked with enough to try to read our human mind. And people wonder why they have a horse that is skittish, insecure, spooky, bites, kicks, is hard to lead or flighty. We teach them to react that

Regional Schooling Show Awards Program Rules

General Information:

- 1. Program year is December 1 through November 30.
- 2. Scores may be earned in any USDF region.
- 3. Late nominations, applications and results submissions will not be accepted.

Rider Eligibility & Requirements:

- 1. Rider must have a USDF Group Membership that is recorded by the Group Member Organization (GMO) at the time the scores are earned.
- 2. Riders affiliated with an International GMO must declare a USDF region.
- 3. Owner must have at least a USDF non-member number at the time the scores are earned.
- 4. Horse must have at least a USDF Horse Identification Number at the time the scores are earned.
- 5. Rider must submit a one-time yearly online nomination and \$35 nomination fee for each horse/rider combination no later than 14 days after the last day of the first competition. The nomination fee must be paid annually.
- 6. Riders may change their division status during the program year. A rider's status will be determined at the end of the program year.
- 7. Rider must submit scores to USDF online no later than 21 days after the last day of the competition.

Award Divisions & Levels:

- 1. Four award divisions will be recognized per region:
 - a. Open: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a USEF Adult Amateur (AA), not a non-professional.
 - b. Junior/Young Rider (Jr/YR): up until the end of the calendar year the rider reaches age 21.
 - c. AA: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22 and possess a current USEF AA card.
 - d. Non-Professional: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a current USEF AA, not a professional.
- 2. Seven levels (freestyle, pas de deux and quadrille not included) will be recognized per division. Exception: only 6 levels are recognized in the open division:
 - a. Introductory (only in Jr/YR, AA and non-professional divisions)
 - b. Training
 - c. First
 - d. Second
 - e. Third
 - f. Fourth
 - g. FEI combination of Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II and Grand Prix scores.

A motion was made by Sheli King and seconded by Robyn Nunnally to accept the minutes from the last meeting. It passed unanimously.

Treasurer's report: Tina reported 137K as combined balances. The ribbons for both shows have been paid.

Chapter Challenge: Meredith reported that the prize list is almost ready. Chapters need to report on what their special prizes will be and how much they will send for the MFS challenge. We need this quickly for the prize list. Anne Harrington is the manager and Carol Thomas will be the secretary.

DAL- Rachel, the volunteer coordinator, reported that she has made an email address just for volunteers- *volunteer-vada@gmail.com* for members to get in contact with her for both shows. We have the preliminary prize list. The biggest change will be changes to SHAC. The goal is to make it easier for competitors to understand which classes they need to enter. Sunday awards ceremonies will go no later than lunch. Awards ceremonies will be mandatory. SHAC Sub-committee teleconference call on May 6th at 8:00 pm.

Fall Show- Sweatshirt colors are still be decided.

2020 USDF Schooling Show Award Program-Attaching the official rules from USDF. Alison Douglas made the motion and it was seconded by Annette for VADA to reimburse each chapter for up to 3 chapter run schooling shows (not a show sanctioned by a chapter) per year. It was passed unanimously.

2020 VADA Banquet: We discussed venues and costs. Jessie brought up having a lower rate for members who have volunteered at VADA events. Right now, the banquet itself costs us \$5000. To that, we have to add awards and ribbons, for a total cost of over \$10K. We don't want to raise the fee per person, so we are brainstorming ideas. way by our own actions.

The solution? Considering your horse as a complete being is a start. Then understanding not how you want them to think, but how to work with and teach them using how they think. Again, here comes the technician/horseman combination. You may create a fabulous horse who can go through the perfect dressage test but dies a few years later from being a nervous wreck because nobody bothered to understand what was inside that horse's head. Once that respect is gained, the next critical step in any training of any horse is for that horse to voluntarily submit to you being the leader and protector. That my friends is called trust and it is earned through doing the ground work.

These things, if you really want to have a true partnership and be able to convey properly all technical aspects of various disciplines of riding a horse, are the way one can achieve complete success and harmony with one of the greatest, most beautiful creatures God ever created. And no short cut will get you this, because when you are one with a horse you are Zen.




